LESSONS .

Bishop's Geoff's focus and determination truly stands distinguished and sitting there in that conference room listening to him just inspired and challenged me a great deal. His presentation revealed a diverse set of crucial issues and through the sound bytes of his voice, I gleaned the following wisdom that is still speaking to me months after hearing.

Bishop Geoff pointed out to the importance of knowing WHAT it is that I want to pursue and do if I will be a prolific advocate capable of turning the turbines of change. he further noted the significance of being committed to the cause for which you stand for. I realised that his successes and accomplishments were as a result of the very same qualities he was sharing with us.

One amazing truth and lesson that I also caught from the Green Bishop was the fact that faith communities didnt just represent religious and spiritual groupings of people who convene for worship but rather the projected portals through which God's creation will be saved.

As humans, we have placed ourselves and our economics at the centre of the picture and because of this stance, we are pausing a great threat to creation. Bishop Geoff strongly pointed out that we need to rise up and address the system of capitalism which demands that we consume more, fish more, cut more forests and pollute more.

Bishop Geoff gave us further reading references, sighting two key books, one by Naomi Klein titled This Changes Everything and another one by Charles Elsenstein titled Sacred Economics.

Gena from UCT gave a spendid presentation that gave me a few insights as a passion filled environmentalist and climate change activist.

Sitting through the sessions was quite an empowering experience for me.

She addressed the issue of adaptation and what I still recall vividly was her definition of adaptation which she put across as an acknowledgment of impacts thought through to determine what it is we need to do.

This totally blew my mind. She spoke of a very important aspect of adaptation which involves a support component to cater for the vulnerable members of concerned communities.

Jessica followed through with a very insightful delivery on water. She left me with an enhanced appreciation of water as an intrinsic component in the frame of life.

Jessica spoke of the importance of water and how it relates to ecosystems. More importantly, she really zeroed in on the aspect of water protection, taking a detour to reveal how mining, industry and agriculture polluted and wasted water. Her encouragement was for the faith communities to work towards changing power relations through influencing laws and regulations, protests and advising.

She gave a very interesting account of how the South African government introduced a free water system which simply means that the government supplied a limited amount of water to households through a smart gadget that cuts supplies when the daily limit is reached as a way of getting people to use water well and place value on it.

Liz was just amazing. She took us through an energy talk which interrogated amongst other issues where we get our energy from. She spoke of an energy revolution that brought us to a place where where we now burn oil and coal, we have cars instead of donkeys, tractors instead of hoes etc.

Liz also passed the same remarks of kilometers of rainforests being mowed down by heavy machines in the name of capitalism.

LESSONS continued .

This really got me thinking a lot on what it is we can do to address this unrighteous system called capitalism.

In wrapping up her session, Liz spoke of the downturn of coal and nuclear power stations as opposed to clean energy solutions like solar.

Mitchel from the program for Infrastructure Development gave a brief presentation that revealed the linkages between Infrastructure development and matters relating to water, energy, Information Technology and transport.

Listening to her speak made me realise that we have a huge task of influencing local governments to do things rights especially within Africa where Infrastructural development is projected to spiral within the next few years.

Day two for me was quite an exciting one. Learning about media and how to ride on it to further our causes was truly an inspiring exercise.

I recall being taught on how to craft and prepare effective press releases

that can be deployed in our advocacy tactics. We learnt of the various specialized styles of writing such as the inverted pyramid style and additional components such as interviewing techniques and media relations.

The practical was fun, and thanks to my brilliant colleagues who were in the same group with me, our press release was given thumbs up.

Sarah Dekker was truly amazing in her presentations, calm as they were! In my opinion, her presentation was of great significance as it revealed great tools and strategies that centered around networking and communication. I really loved the session and got an opportunity to refine and sharpen a few of my existing skills as a communications expert.

Sarah talked of Media activism as a tool to further movements that are pushing for social change. Her presentation revealed a diverse set of tools that activist can embrace and ride on to share their work and efforts, mobilizing people and building networks. For me, this was a crucial component of the training because so many brilliant efforts and ideas die prematurely as they fail to gather the needed momentum to survive and effect change. I have seen the power of media activism from the communities that I have had the privilege to train and equip within those regards. My only recommendation would be for SAFCEI to include a session on communication and branding as they happen to be crucial plugins that complement media activism.

long range strategies & short term actions

INTRODUCTION .

I genuinely love the book of Proverbs because of all the wisdom found in it. One particular verse that speaks to me intensely is **Proverbs 24 vs 3**, which reads **“Through wisdom, is a house built, and by understanding it is established”**

On the premise of the above scripture and conviction, my first determination was to trust God for a set of key strategies that would not be once off transactions but rather evolve into sustained frameworks for continued action. This brought me to a place where I started framing Long range strategies that potentially could be carried in practice for years to come and be applied in different geographical regions.

Inspired by the book of **James 1 vs 22**, which reads **“But be ye doers of the Word, and not hearers only deceiving your own selves”**, I knew that there was a place for action drawing from what I had learnt during the training.

My approach then came out as a two tier approach focusing on Long range plans as well as short term action.

In the next few paragraphs, I explore and share with you my journey so far. I trust that it will encourage and inspire you to seek the good in yourself, roll it out and influence others to do the same.

LONG RANGE STRATEGIES

The following section explores the following Long Range Strategies

- a) ACCCC - Annual Christian Climate Change Convention
- b) Creation Series
- c) Creation Stewardship Pledge
- d) Green Faith Awards

Categorically, I structured my efforts into two distinct groupings namely **Long Range Strategies and Short Term Actions**. For me, it carried a lot of weight to slot into place structures and frameworks that would inspire and support continued action coordinated from a central place. This motivated me to frame a number of key strategies that are endowed with great capacity to strengthen the stewardship culture within the greater Christian Faith community.

ACCCC - Annual Christian Climate Change Convention.

The Annual Christian Climate Change Convention is an ongoing yearly conference convened by the Climate Impact Faith Alliance together with its working partners under the UCCE (Union of Concerned Christian Environmentalists) framework. This is a large scale and formal convocation hosted by CIFA (Climate Impact Faith Alliance), drawing spiritual leaders and Christian faith premised experts to assess and deliberate on the Church’s position and stance in addressing climate change and environmental injustice.

The CIFA annual convention on Climate Change and environmental management sets an overall pedestal for the adoption and implementation of the CCEF (Collective Common Efforts Framework) which stands as a foundational tool to coordinate Church driven efforts to curb the challenge posed by climate change and environmental injustice.

The ACCCC is premised on the CIFA definition of Climate Change which describes Climate Change as the exacerbated warming of the earth due to bad stewardship of God’s creation. Inspired by this school of thought, the CIFA Annual Christian Climate Convention is a space for crucial conversations that will inform the much needed action towards change.

The Convention draws membership from different Christian denominations and para Church institutions making up the engine that ratifies the CIFA Earth Pledge (A stewardship commitment document that draws Spiritual leaders, Institutions and congregations together for Collective Common Efforts.

The ACCCC provides the Church with an opportunity to exchange vital information and wisdom pertaining to global warming, climate change, policies strategies and best practices. Additionally, participants frame and adopt strategies for adapting and mitigating climate change. Most importantly, the convention invites Governments to the table to hear the voice of reason as beamed by the Church.

long range strategies & short term actions

CREATION SERIES.

The Creation Series effort is an ongoing and continuing work that seeks to inculcate a stewardship sense and lifestyle within the Christian Faith landscape. It's a deliberate effort to influence human behavior towards actions that guarantee low carbon and sustainable environmental, ecological and climate futures.

The Creation Series experience takes place every year from the 1st to the 14th of July. We have marked these 14 days of July as "14 days of creation stewardship", where we coordinate diverse pragmatic actions hosted by different denominations and individuals too. During the 14 day window frame, we encourage and invite Churches, Para – Church organizations, Christian businesses, Christian Schools, Universities and colleges and individuals to organize local actions that promote the broader concept of creation stewardship. We gazette a list of possible actions from which congregations, organizations and individuals can select from. Activities may include tree planting, awareness campaigns on water, energy or emissions, an entire church getting all its members to switch to energy saving lights, doing energy, water or greenhouse gas emissions audits.

Stories from different communities highlighting varying efforts are then shared with the greater Christian faith family. The Creation Series effort also feeds into our Green Faith Awards.

CREATION STEWARDSHIP PLEDGE

"Formulated by Sean Innocent Ukomba and Promulgated by CIFA, the Creation Stewardship Pledge is a petition based commitment that has been specifically framed to mobilise spiritual leaders and their respective congregations towards the adoption of an earth stewardship action framework in pursuit of low carbon and sustainable futures."

The Creation Stewardship Pledge as a tool serves to inspire common actions that are coordinated from a central point to increase concentration towards impact. It's a foundational effort that creates endless possibilities for the application of stewardship mechanisms, models and actions within the Christian Faith Landscape.

The Creation Stewardship Pledge is a call to affirmation of the Churches commitment to creation care. It's a key document that represents the combined voice of the Church in matters relating to climate, ecology and the environment.

GREEN FAITH AWARDS

"The Green Faith Awards were set up to celebrate, honor, recognize and encourage Christian faith premised individuals, groups of people and organizations striving to realize sustainable outcomes within earth keeping parameters."

The awards serve to inspire action and the formulation of creative and strategic wide cast compatible solutions, models, mechanisms and actions that add value to the overall contribution being factored in by the Church in addressing climate and environmental injustice. It's a pedestal upon which best practices are harvested, adopted and shares with the greater Christian Faith community.

LONG RANGE STRATEGIES A deeper insight.

The strategies detailed on this page and the previous one started as inspired thoughts that were then developed and given structure. My organisation has embraced and adopted all of them and regimented them as official organisational programs that we will be building on in the next few years. Additionally, the **EFZ - Evangelical Fellowship of Zimbabwe and the Student Christian Movement of Zimbabwe** have already adopted the framework as network partners. I have Scheduled meetings and will be meeting with **ZCC - Zimbabwe Council of Churches** to discuss and foster partnerships.

Additionally, these programs will be presented this June at a very key and crucial platform that is bringing together all African **Evangelical Associations** for a conference in Zimbabwe. My projection is that these Long Range frameworks will be adopted and be spread into Africa through these strategic links. The beauty of it all is the fact that all these programs are built on a perpetual foundation.

OWN YOUR NEIGHBOURHOOD

In November of 2014, in partnership with a number of local churches that are within the Mt Pleasant residential area, I launched a community action driven effort that I named **adopt your neighbourhood**. Participating Churches provided man and labour hours by bringing their families, workers (maids and gardeners), refreshments and equipment such as vehicles, grass trimmers, shovels, wheel barrows etc. Every second weekend of every month, these groupings continue to convene and every time they convene, they take ownership of Mt Pleasant through picking litter up, removing trash, painting verges, filling up potholes and planting trees. The adopt your neighborhood strategy has been received as a transferrable model that is set to spread wherever groups of Christians gather to take ownership of their domains and be exemplary in stewardship pursuits.

THE CHALLENGE

Mt pleasant as a community had degraded and still is to some extent. Grass grows wild, road markings have faded, trash hips are evident on select corners and potholes are just everywhere. The nucleus of my activities is a place called Bond shopping centre. One of our offices is housed there so I felt it noble to launch the effort right in our front and back yards.

Without wasting much time, I gathered a few individuals comprising of residents, shop owners and local vendors and presented to them the possibilities of renewing the place through stewardship. They all seemed engaged and that just motivated me to launch phase two of my series of actions. I then developed a flier that we spread around with the help of the shop owners and the vendors. Because we needed to get a few resources to make our efforts lubricated, I then approached the chairman of the Mt Pleasant business association who remarkably managed to collect contributions from the business owners that operate at Bond centre. With the collections, we secured paints, brushed, bin liners, gloves and masks that came in handy. On the 8th of November people started pitching up in their work suits and boots, ready to fix the place. Before we knew it, the action had started. My team and I organised people into teams and we had so many people just digging in joyously. We cut grass, repainted the verges, swept and moved all the trash that was in heaps, filled up potholes. In a day, people wouldnt believe the change. The most amazing part of all this was that as we shared snacks and refreshments, individual families started making pledges to go back home and put order in their own streets. My friend the Chairman of the Mt Pleasant Business Association came through with a handsome donation

and with that empowerment, we purchased metal bins that we then sank strategically, reinforcing with concrete to guard against vandalism and possible theft.

GREEN NLCC MODEL

Zimbabwe as a nation is statistically regarded as an 85 to 90 % Christian nation. Well, that finding really alarmed me because a number of questions started spinning in my mind. If we are an 80% Christian nation, how then can we be a nation that has very little concern for God's gift of creation? If indeed we happen to be an 85% Christian nation, so who is trashing our communities? Who is cutting down trees and wasting water and energy? Who is disturbing the ecological balance of nature and tempering with ecosystems. Surely it couldnt be the 15%. NO WAYS. Here is what I found, that the Church has in actual fact contributed greatly to the above issues in question. Surely, strategies are needed to help muscle up the capacity of the Church to do the one thing that God expects from us, to steward the earth and all life forms correctly.

If the Church was part of the team manufacturing some of these problems, it therefore meant that my very own Church was not exempted. The need to build the capacity of the Church brought me to a place where I built a program that I named Green NLCC. Whats that, someone is probably exclaiming. Well, I attend a Church that is known as New Life Covenant Church, so Green NLCC is the brand through which New Life Covenant Church makes significant contributions towards building the stewardship capacity of the Church as a whole, of individuals as well as of families within the Church.

Having developed the model, I then shared it with the Church office and leadership who immediately fell in love with it and took it up as an official wing of the Church. Under the Green NLCC banner, the following activities were hosted.

I have plans of sharing the same model with as many denominations as can receive it but for now, I am closely monitoring its development within my very own Church so as to tweak it up if need be before applying it elsewhere.

10KM Run for a Clean Harare

Having adopted the Green NLCC model, my Church had a series of meetings with me and out of those deliberations, action trails were crafted and rolled out. My Bishop is an iconic figure who commands a lot of influence. Years ago, he launched an annual marathon that has been named after him and for years, this event has been a remarkable fundraiser for the Church. Following the adoption and launch of the Green NLCC model, the Church dedicated the 2015 edition of the marathon to Green NLCC, subtitled it as the Tudor Bismark 10KM Run for a clean Harare. All proceeds raised were dedicated to stewardship activities such as bin purchasing, Island adoptions, educational materials etc. An excess of 4000 people attended.

Running simultaneously with the 10KM marathon, we staged a 5KM clean up walk campaign that saw about 400 church members cleaning the streets within the Eastlea area. So much trash was collected as an army of joyous believers walked through the streets, leaving nothing behind but a clean environment.

Open Exhibitions

Before the run and the walk started, the Church congregated at motor action sports club, where we had exhibiton booths set into place with materials and content that were framed to capacitate individuals and families on how to be better stewards. I managed to invite a number of organisations to send their teams to mix and mingle with members from my church, sharing wisdom and resources in the process. We even had a recycling company present, showing people how to separate waste and reuse it.

City Islands adoption

The Church soon took up a new passion which involved adopting islands within the city. Following the adoption of the Green NLCC model and framework, the Church led by my Bishop's wife Pastor Chichi Bismark has adopted 2 islands so far; cleaning them and giving them a new lease of life. These islands are monitored and dressed everyday, funded by the proceeds raised from the run and other revenues from the Church.

implemented activities

Green Events

Our Church has a mega church status and boasts of thousands of congregants. Every year, we host very big conferences that uses power, water and materials in large amounts. Some of the recommendations that I put through in my meetings with the Church pointed to greening our events and amazingly, the Church has taken the issue up and as of 2015, all New Life Covenant Church's events are green. One of the most amazing changes that was effected was the discontinued usage of posters and fliers. We used to advertise our events through thousands of posters and fliers but as of late, all advertising is green compatible and the Church now uses methods that are green.

Green Infrastructure

Our Church is currently driving processes to erect a massive building and complex that's going to house a new Church building, offices and Bible school. Under the green NLCC framework, the Church is making plans and provisions to ensure that all building processes are greened and that at the end of the construction, the building will stand iconic, not only in its size and structure but in integrity and environmental qualities. The auditorium alone will be a 10 000 sitters facility. Already, conversations concerning clean energy powering the facility are huge considerations.

Waste Management.

As Zimbabweans, one of our greatest challenges is waste management. We have become a nation that generates waste at unprecedented rates yet our municipalities cannot effectively address its administration. In the model that I crafted, waste management is a key component and our Church has taken up the role to ensure that all households represented within the church are taught and capacitated to separate waste effectively. I have had meetings with a private company that is set to collect all separated waste from our church members and remit payments for the waste. This effort is currently being piloted and we anticipate great results, after which we will export the model to other congregations.

BE THE CHANGE FRIDAY NIGHTS

One of the things that I knew I needed to do was to spread the inspiration I felt within me. How could I leave the FLEAT training and fail to generate a contagious wave of inspiration for transformation. Pondering through the subject, I made a resolve to start a series of talk sessions, something that I decided to name “**BE THE CHANGE FRIDAY NIGHTS**”. Two Fridays in a month, through existing networks, I invited diverse representatives from different youth groups to be a part of these talk nights. The basic features of the program included inviting a guest to present a talk of choice as long as it pointed to stewardship. In the six sessions that I have hosted from November 2014, we have had a great time with young people and amazing presenters. The sessions always end with a discussion where ideas are captured and followed through. The idea of the nights is set to grow in 2015 and I plan on introducing a practical component to the sessions.



ADOPT YOUR STREET COCKTAIL PITCH.

Within the month of November again, I had the privilege of hosting a pitch cocktail to garner support and spread the **ADOPT YOUR NEIGHBOURHOOD** effort. The cocktail was well attended by reps from a number of churches as well as Christian business people and activist. The event was a 2 hour experience and I managed to fund it through support from my good friend Ross Conlon, the CEO of PrintWorks. It was a great evening that planted the idea and concept in many hearts and again in 2015, I will be doing follow up's to see how well we can further the development of the idea.

innovations

By default, I am an innovator and inventor of models and strategies and following the FLEAT training, I really felt so much life and innovation flowing through me. I remember that in one of the sessions, I spoke about Trees For Wheels, a Technology based innovation that I developed to address carbon emissions from the motoring sector.

TREES FOR WINGS.

As I sat on my flight from Cape Town to Johannesburg, I got a bit bored and in a moment, I pulled out my iPad, switched it on and went straight to my PDF archive to look at my travel itinerary just to ensure the scheduled time for my Harare flight. As I browsed through the electronic ticket saved on my iPad, I was astounded when I read the fine print at the bottom of ticket which revealed the huge amounts of emissions that the equipment (plane) was going to spew for that Harare flight alone. Ideas started rolling within my mind. Having landed at O.R International, as I walked through the shops awaiting my flight, an idea hit me strongly and over the next few days, I put thought to it. I then came up with another innovation that I have named Trees For Wings. It's a technology based mobile solution to make significant contributions towards addressing emissions from the aviation industry. Sadly, at the moment I am developing the model and cannot reveal much details at the moment but sooner.

OZONE CLASS.

My innovative component is also finding expression through the development of an online training facility that I named "The Ozone Class". The idea has already been adopted by my organisation CIFA. Think of the Ozone Class as a school but one in which students learn from their mobile phones, tablets and personal computers with all the benefits and privileges that students learning in a physical environment will have. The Ozone class is set to grant the Christian faith community access to quality courses that are structured to build the stewardship capacity of the Church in remarkable ways. I have already developed the backbone of the school and currently looking around for funding to host this amazing innovation as well as to fund course development in a number of key areas.
